GOVERNANCE

This fact sheet is based on data from the Open Data Impact Map, a public database of organizations that use open data from around the world. 252 governance-related orgs were assessed to develop these findings. To learn more, visit: <http://OpenDataImpactMap.org/governance>

A large number of organizations worldwide use open data to improve governance. They are primarily nonprofits that use open data to monitor budgets, spending and elections, evaluate the performance of public projects, and conduct issue-based advocacy. The most used types open data include government operations, legal, health, and demographic and social.

HOW ORGANIZATIONS USE OPEN DATA

In many countries, organizations:

- Utilize data on budgets and spending to expose and prevent mismanagement and corruption
- Monitor government contracting and procurement
- Use demographic and voter data to improve voter registration and representation, as well as to provide information on polling stations
- Use open data for issue-based advocacy and citizen engagement more generally; for example, organizations use spending and performance information on health or education to reveal and deter corruption that can keep institutions from getting the funds they're entitled to

Website that features visualizations of past elections according to voter trends based on gender, voter representation in Parliament, etc.

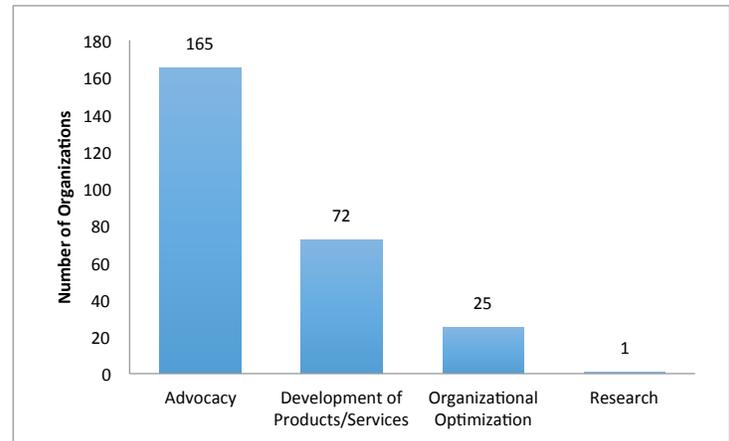
